The forum brought together diverse stakeholders, including traditional leaders, senators, security personnel and government officials to recognize that security is not just the responsibility of those in uniform. HCD is a people-focused approach that puts communities at the heart of development programming. It emphasises empathy, collaboration, and iterative problem-solving, ensuring solutions respond to real needs. The training is part of the Civil Society Strengthening Programme – ShiftThePower. We are developing strategies to apply HCD principles in programme design, facilitate stakeholder conversations to understand lived experiences, and translate insights into actionable strategies.

We will also work with partner organisations involved in the CSSP-ShiftThePower initiative to co-create strategies that are relevant and context-driven. This experience strengthens civil society actors' ability to co-create sustainable solutions that truly reflect community voices.

Breaking the Cycle of Violent Extremism: Daina's Story of Economic Empowerment and Resistance

Prior to benefiting from the BRAVE I livelihood skills initiative, Kuusanang Daina, a mother and resident of Fielmuo was an unemployed housewife. Her lack of income contributed to household tensions between she and her husband. Daina's parents are still in Burkina Faso, and she has had to support them from afar. This increased her economic vulnerability, a condition often exploited by violent extremist groups.....[read more](#)

From Silence to Influence: Cashew Farmers in Bono Find Their Voice



Before the implementation of the AVID-II project, cashew farmers in the Bono Region, particularly in Jaman North, Jaman South, Banda, and Tain Districts, operated largely at the margins of decision-making processes that directly affected their livelihoods. Farmer groups were weakly organized, cooperative leadership structures were underdeveloped, and most farmers had limited understanding of advocacy, negotiation, and policy engagement.

As a result, cashew farmers had little influence over pricing, access to markets, or public sector support. Engagements with government institutions and private sector actors were largely informal and uncoordinated, leaving farmers vulnerable to exploitation and exclusion. Women and youth farmers were rarely represented in leadership spaces, and their voices were largely absent from discussions on sector development.

From unsafe beginnings to institutional strength – Akwatialine Scrap Sellers Transform Through CSSF Support

For years, members of the Akwatialine Scrap Sellers Association in Kumasi dismantled metal and electronic waste under harsh and unsafe conditions. Workers lacked protective gear, discarded valuable materials, and endured poor health as a result of toxic exposure. The work was tough, the earnings meagre, and the risks high.

"Now we extract waste in smarter ways that increase our earnings," said Awal Zakaria, Assistant Secretary of the Association. "Through training and capacity building, we've learned to recycle and repurpose materials we once destroyed. I've even started a new venture repurposing laptop batteries and solar panels. It has been very beneficial."

Beyond the Breadline: How Huzaifa's Tools Are Building Circuits, and Community Resilience Against Violent Extremism

In the dry Savannah landscape of Ghana's Upper East Region, opportunity is often shaped by geography. Communities are dispersed, economic activity is seasonal, and livelihoods depend heavily on rain-fed agriculture. During the long dry season, income sources shrink, and young people, especially women, face limited options. In this context, vulnerability to economic distress, social exclusion, and exposure to violent extremism (VE) narratives increases.

It is within this environment that the SURE Project, implemented by STAR-Ghana Foundation, is working to strengthen community resilience through livelihood skills development.....[read more](#)

Influence isn't just about visibility it's about agenda-setting, resource allocation, and legislative reform. When empowered, women in leadership have been shown globally to prioritize social investments, expand access to health and education, and push for legal reforms that protect women and children. For instance, a World Bank study (2012) found that countries with higher female parliamentary representation were more likely to allocate resources toward health and education.
